Kia ora koutou,

I wanted to start this week by acknowledging the parts of the country that have experienced the dramatic destruction of Cyclone Gabrielle. This is traumatic for communities to have experienced such devastation, destruction, and loss. It looks to be a massive job to recover and to get back to what was there before. Kelburn Normal will do whatever we can to help schools, but please support any agency providing relief to the affected areas if you can.

Camp - Whānui thoroughly enjoyed their camp at Makahika last week, even including spending a night in the bush as part of their programme. Makahika is a terrific place to go for camp, but even still it is a big effort to organise and run a camp and thank you to Jen, Emma, and Rebekah for their organisation and to parent helpers - Nina, Antonio, Alsu, Andrew, and Kirsten for their support for our tamariki.

Parking - Consideration of others when Parking around the school is important. YOUR TALKING GUIDE FOR TEACHING YOUR CHILD ABOUT RESPECT:

"Stop being disrespectful!"

Often we think our children just KNOW exactly what we expect from them. But they might not. Unless we TALK about it.

Respect is about showing we care about:

- the feelings and needs of PEOPLE
- the rules and order of PLACES
- the protection and importance of THINGS



We can replace the word "respect" with the words "care about":

"I want you to respect my feelings." \longrightarrow "I want you to care about my feelings."

Discuss who and what each family member RESPECTS:



Let's talk about people and things we care about. I respect our grandma—she courageously stood up for her beliefs. Who or what do YOU respect?

Discuss what **feeling RESPECTED** means for each family member:



What does feeling respected mean for each one of us? I feel respected when someone talks to me in a calm manner.

Brainstorm examples of how to **SHOW RESPECT to others**:

- ♦ Understand another person's point of view ♦ Honor rules to stay safe
- Use kind words and tones of voice
- Use care with items
