## **Life Education Trust**

Last week, we hosted the Life Education Trust and Harold for Years 1-6. The Life Education lessons and Harold the giraffe are national institutions and visit most schools in Aotearoa. Life Education Trust lessons offer our tamariki engaging learning that helps them understand how to look after their bodies, minds, and relationships. Through interactive activities and positive messages, tamariki are reinforced in making healthy choices, recognising emotions, and building respectful connections with others. These sessions complement our wellbeing focus and our current health programmes. The \$8 cost will be added to your student statement. This year's focus questions were:

**Tupu**: Social Relationships - How do we keep our friends safe with our words and our hands?; How can we be a safe person with our friends?

**Whanake:** Self-Esteem and Social Relationships - How can I be a good friend?; Why might we react and respond differently to our world and those around us?

**Whānui:** Digital Citizenship - What is personal information?; How do the decisions I make online and/or offline affect me and others?

## 2026 Whānau/Parent Conversations

These important conversations are an opportunity for whānau to talk to their child's new teacher to share insights that would be useful for the teacher to know. ## 2026 Whanake Learn to Swim and Water Safety Programme - Term 1, 2026

In term 1, Whanake will be participating in eight swimming lessons at Karori Pool. These will be held on Wednesdays, starting from Wednesday 11th February (Week 2) and concluding Wednesday 1st April (Week 9).

The cost of the bus and the swimming lessons, run by swimming instructors, will be \$70. This will be added to your student statement. You can also pay by direct credit to 12-3223-0190001-00 using your child's name and swimming as a reference or by EFTPOS at the school office.

Each team will be travelling by bus to and from Karori Pool each week. The times for each team are listed below: Whanake Rua: Leave school at 12pm, return to school by 1.30pm. Whanake Tahi: Leave school at 12.30pm, return to school by 2pm. Whanake Toru: Leave school at 1pm, return to school by 2.30pm. (NB These times indicate the bus pick-up and drop-off times back at school, not the actual swimming lesson duration.)

On swimming days, please remember to send your child to school with their togs, towel, and goggles (if they use them), all named and in a bag.

Dear parents and caregivers of Year 4 and 5 children

Looking ahead to 2026, we are planning the biannual Whānui Camp. It will be at El Rancho in Waikanae. The camp's primary purpose is to set the stage for the year's learning and establish positive relationships between tamariki.

For all whānau, the requested donation towards the cost of the camp is \$320 per child. # **Phones and Smart Watches**



This is a friendly reminder that we strongly recommend that children do not bring phones or smart watches to school. These items are not allowed in the learning spaces, or to be used at all during school hours.
