Tupu - End of Term in Te Ara Tupu and PMP in Term 3

Kia ora Parents and Whānau,

We are sharing what we have planned for the remainder of this term and an exciting term 3 activity for all the tamariki, which we need a lot of whānau support.

We are looking forward to our bug hotel creations in the last week of term on Wednesday, 25th June. Please bring sticks, leaves, cardboard boxes, tubes and maybe even some pinecones. Please bring your materials by Monday 23rd June, ready for our creativity. These will be coming home to be placed in a special place at your whare.

The last day for reading books to come home, mathematics, printing and writing lessons will be Wednesday 25th June. The final day for poetry is Thursday 19th June. The last BSLA information sheet for the term will be on the week starting Monday 16th June, and the last week of the term will be a revisiting week.

The Sunshine Online reading and Mathematics programme, a valuable resource for your child to use over the holidays, will be updated and ready to use by the last week of school. If you are new to kura, in the last week of term, you will receive an information sheet with your child's username and password, which you can use to access the programme.

Please return all library books by Monday 23rd June. Any artwork will be coming home in the last week of term.

Next term, term 3, we plan to have the Perceptual Motor Programme (PMP) running in our Tupu team. This programme is designed to develop tamariki balance, hand/eye/foot co-ordination, fitness, body image, body control and locomotion skills. We have found that in the past, tamariki have really enjoyed PMP, and there have been many benefits from the programme.

To run this programme, we need committed parental assistance. This would involve being at school from 8:55am to 11:00am on a Tuesday or a Thursday. The programme needs to have six parents on each session. We don't mind if you can do only one session or many more.

The dates that we are having PMP sessions are as follows; Tuesday 15th July & Thursday 17th July Tuesday 22nd July & Thursday 24nd July Tuesday 29th July & Thursday 31st July Tuesday 5th August & Thursday 7th August

Parents are assigned an activity that is clearly set out for them, with instructions on what the children are working on. You work with a small group of children in each class. This is a great opportunity for hands-on assistance.
