#### Schoolwide Updates

#### Mihi Whakatau – Thursday 5 February

Our first mihi whakatau is set for Thursday 5 February at 12.00 noon. We look forward to welcoming new whānau. If you are new to our kura, please come along so we can formally welcome you.

#### Whānau Information Evening – Wednesday 11 February

Next week, we have our Whānau Information hui held at 5.30 pm on Wednesday, 11 February in the teaching spaces. Each ara: Te Ara Tupu, Te Ara Whanake, Te Ara Whānui, and Te Ara Māia, are looking forward to sharing with you how each ara is set up for learning this year. Kaiako will share a presentation, including camp information, and will have time for questions and discussion. No need to sign in, just come to the learning spaces.

#### International & Bilingual Whānau Afternoon Tea – 19 February 2:30 pm

We will be hosting an afternoon tea on **Thursday 19 February** for the whānau of our international students, bilingual families, and English Language Learners (ELLs).

This will be a relaxed opportunity to connect, meet other families, and spend some time together at school. We will use this occasion to share information with you about the support we offer our English Language Learners and answer any questions you may have. More information will be sent shortly.

## Performing Arts

Our kura has a long history as a creative school, renowned for excellence in the performing arts. The first four words in our school vision are ... "where students learn creatively..."

Tamariki have the opportunity to participate in and contribute to various performing arts ensembles. The common purpose of these groups is to enrich the curriculum and promote children's engagement and well-being at school. We strongly encourage ākonga to join an ensemble, as we have observed significant benefits of joining musical ensembles for both well-being and academic success in and out of kura.

**The Choirs:** **Lyrica Choir** - Lyrica is the school's year 6 to 8 choir. It is our only auditioned choir and achieves a high level of excellence. The choir learns to sing a wide repertoire of music across different styles, in several parts, and in several languages, including challenging three-part pieces.

It performs regularly at school events, in the wider community, at cultural events and celebrations. Lyrica meets weekly on Monday from 8:30 to 9:30am, and is directed by Anna Sedcole, with assistance from Mrs Munn.

Lyrica auditions are tomorrow in the hall. Year 6-8 tamariki are encouraged to head along and audition by singing Happy Birthday and repeating a few notes, so come along and try out!

**Piccolo Choir** - This is an all-comers choir for tamariki who love to sing, year 4 upwards, no audition is necessary. They meet 8.30 to 9.30 am on Thursdays in the Mahler music room, this is led by Anna Sedcole, with assistance from Mr Miller.

**Tui Choir:** This is our junior school choir (years 2 & 3) and is led by Ms Smith. It is held on Thursday in the hall from 9 - 9:30am.

**The Instrumental Groups: The School Orchestra** - Tamariki from years 4-8 can play in the school orchestra. The orchestra includes all sections of a full orchestra. They perform classical and contemporary pieces at school assemblies and events, as well as at the primary school orchestra festival. They meet on Wednesday at 8:20-9:30am and are conducted by Mrs Katharina Vautier and Ms Rachel Smith. Are you interested in joining the orchestra? Have you been playing your instrument longer than a year? It is lots of fun playing together. We encourage all year 4-8 tamariki who play an instrument to come along to the Mahler music room this Wednesday at 8:20am with some music that they can play.

**Little Xylofun** - This is the ensemble for our younger, Year 2 & 3, students. This is a great way to get used to making music together using xylophones, glockenspiels, and other percussion instruments. The children learn all pieces by ear; no music-reading skills are required. Led by Mrs Katharina Vautier, held 9.00am to 9.30am on Fridays in the Mahler music room.

**Xylobeats** - Our Xylophone/percussion ensemble is very similar to our Little Xylofun group, a step up for our year 4 to 6 students. Led by Mrs Katharina Vautier, held 8.30 to 9.30am on Tuesdays in the Mahler music room.

**The School Bands** - Tamariki from years 6-8 can audition to be in one of our school bands, taught by Mr Jeremy Desmond and Mr Tristan Carter. There is a small charge for whānau to cover our band teachers' time and expertise. If your child plays an instrument and wants to learn how to rock out with others, they can come to an audition. If children are in the band, they must be taking music lessons for their instruments, and singers must be in the choir and/or take singing lessons. We will collect the names of people who want to audition and what instruments they play from Monday. Auditions will be held soon, and we will let the children know.

**Kapa Haka - Senior Kapa Haka** - On Friday, 8:30 - 9:30 am, years 5-8, work to fine-tune their performance as well as learn new korero, waiata, rakau, and haka led by Matua Henare Parata, supported by Ms Rebekah Rasmussen and Ms Rachel Smith.

**Junior Kapa Haka** - On Tuesday afternoon, tamariki from year 1-4 engage with Matua Jeremy Desmond to introduce and develop our youngest students with Kapa Haka.

## Phones and Smart Watches



This is a friendly reminder that we strongly recommend that children do not bring phones or smart watches to school. These items are not allowed in the learning spaces, or to be used at all during school hours. If students need to bring these items to school, the best thing is to hand them into the office at the beginning of the day, and collect them as they leave. If the item has the ability to record sound, take photos, message, call, or access the internet, it is classed as a smart watch or phone.

**School Hui** - to help ensure a safe transition at the end of each hui, we kindly ask whānau to either stay in the hall or exit the hall through the side exit doors by the road patrol shed. Please then wait in the playground at your regular pickup spot so all tamariki can use the link to return to the learning spaces to collect their bags and be released from their class on time. In the interests of health and safety, please keep the linkway and doors clear at all times. Thank you for your support and understanding.

**Parking** - Just a friendly reminder to please follow our parking guidelines during pick-up and drop-off times. If grandparents or friends are collecting your child, we kindly ask that you remind them to park legally and respect the designated parking zones and drop-off areas.

**Parking on Boundary Rd** - Please do not park in front of the garages on Boundary Road. We have received complaints from neighbours who regularly have their vehicles blocked in by parents who have parked in front of their garages.

**Security Cameras** - As mentioned in previous newsletters, following the damage to the shade sail (and subsequent theft of the school bell), the School Board decided to install CCTV cameras on school premises. These cameras have been installed for the purpose of preventing and detecting vandalism and other damage to school property as well as any health and safety issues occurring outside school hours. The cameras do not record during school hours. The Board has now updated the [School's Privacy Policy](#) and has adopted a [Camera Surveillance policy](#). These are available here and I encourage all members of the school community to review these.
