Matariki

Matariki - Matariki is approaching and each year we deepen our understanding and knowledge of Matariki and all that it entails. This year we will enjoy our Matariki Community Celebration - this evening - Rāpare 18 Pipiri/Hune 2025 5:30-7pm at our kura. We will begin the celebrations with a welcome and our wonderful Kapa Haka group performing for us.

For Matariki this year we are focussing on the following three kaupapa:

Matariki Hunga Nui - Remembrance (Recognition)

- Honouring those we have lost since the last rising of Matariki
- Remembering where we've come from over the last year
- Matariki Ahunga Nui Celebrating the Present (Gratitude)
- Gathering together to give thanks for what we have
- Acknowledging what we have achieved
- Matariki Manako Nui Looking to the future (Preparation)
- Looking forward to the promise of a new year

Puanga is a star near Matariki. For some iwi, Matariki is not seen clearly from their locality. The star that is seen and important to them is Puanga. Te mana whenua o Te Kura o Kelburn is Te Ati Awa, from Taranaki. The tribes of Taranaki, Whanganui, parts of the Far North and parts of the South Island recognise Puanga. Many of these iwi still refer to Matariki and the other names in the constellation in their tribal narratives - however Puanga is given preference. You can read more about Puanga here:




